TELEPHONE SERVICES

CITIZEN SERVICE CENTRE

To request information about any municipal service or to report an incident, the Citizen Service Centre (CSC) is your first point of access. The CSC can be reached by calling ② 311 (in Longueuil) or ② 450-463-7311 (outside of Longueuil), by emailing 311@longueuil.quebec, or online at monportail.longueuil.quebec.

② 211

② 211 is a free telephone and online (211qc.ca) service that lets you find nearby social or community resources. Open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., seven days a week, this service is a goldmine of information for all citizens of Longueuil, and especially for the more vulnerable groups, such as low-income families, caregivers, seniors, disabled persons, immigrants, etc.

OFFICE OF THE LONGUEUIL OMBUDSMAN: A PERSONALIZED SERVICE AT YOUR FINGERTIPS

Any person or group residing on the territory of Ville de Longueuil whose voice was not heard or who did not receive a satisfactory response from the various levels of the municipal administration can request the intervention of the Ombudsman.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

AUTOMATED CALL SYSTEM

The city has an automated call system, which is used to notify citizens during emergency situations. Alerts are sent by telephone, text message and email in various situations, such as boil-water advisories, gas leaks or evacuation orders.

AGGLOMÉRATION DE LONGUEUIL POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Agglomération de Longueuil police department is tasked with maintaining peace, order and public security on the territories of Boucherville, Brossard, Saint-Bruno-de-Montarville and Saint-Lambert. To report a crime or an emergency that requires immediate police assistance, dial ② 911.

AGGLOMÉRATION DE LONGUEUIL FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Agglomération de Longueuil fire department provides fire prevention and protection services to the entire territory of the Agglomération de Longueuil. Firefighters are spread out over 11 fire stations and are prepared to respond rapidly to fires or other disasters (motor vehicle accident, hazardous materials spill, etc.). To report a fire, dial ② 911.

ELECTED OFFICIALS AT YOUR SERVICE

BOROUGH COUNCILS

A borough council is made up of councillors who represent the borough on city council. The jurisdictions of the borough councils include urban planning, waste collection, and the planning of leisure activities.

CITY COUNCIL

The city council is made up of the mayor and 15 councillors. Its members manage the city's affairs and determine its main orientations. City council meetings are open to the public*.


They are an opportunity for citizens to ask their elected officials various questions about how the city is run.

AGGLOMÉRATION DE LONGUEUIL COUNCIL

The Agglomération de Longueuil council is made up of 10 members: the mayor of the central city, the mayor of each of the four reconstituted municipalities, and five councillors from the central municipality (Longueuil), appointed by Longueuil's mayor.

The public can attend* these meetings. A question period is reserved for the public at each meeting. The jurisdictions of the Agglomération council include municipal assessments, public transit, water, public security, the municipal court, and social housing.

The council meetings are broadcast live on Ville de Longueuil's **YouTube channel**.

This section presents a summary of the municipal by-laws. It is not intended to replace the official texts adopted by the borough councils, the city council, or the agglomeration council.

Make sure to check with the city before doing any work.

You can apply for a construction permit online at permisenligne.longueuil.quebec or in person at 4300 chemin de la Savane.

For any other permit, you must go to our tax counters: 4250 chemin de la Savane.

CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION AND DEMOLITION



Permit required

A permit is required for any new construction, demolition or modification of a building (interior or exterior), for the addition of ancillary structures, or for cutting trees.

VIEUX-LONGUEUIL HERITAGE SITE



Permit required

Any owner wishing to:

- make changes to the exterior of a building;
- build or expand a main or ancillary building;
- subdivide a lot;
- modify or replace signage;
- fully or partially demolish a building;

must apply for a permit or an authorization certificate before proceeding.

PERMANENT CARPORTS



Permit required

A carport is an ancillary structure attached to the main building and comprising a roof resting on columns or walls. It is used for parking one or more vehicles. If you wish to build, demolish, or modify a carport, you must first apply for a permit. It is important to avoid encroaching on the right-of-way.

TEMPORARY CARPORTS

Permit not required

The complete installation of a temporary carport is authorized between November 1 and April 15. The structure must be installed on the property, on the existing parking space. Materials permitted for temporary carports are metal for the frame, and synthetic or polyethylene fabric for the cover.







WATERING

Watering using a hose with a hand-held spray nozzle or an automatic shutoff valve is permitted at all times.

Watering with timed sprinklers is permitted between 4 a.m. and 6 a.m. daily, except on Wednesdays and Sundays.

Watering with sprinklers not equipped with a timer is permitted only between 7 p.m. and 11 p.m. on the following days:

NEW LAWNS

Special permit required

Watering of new lawns is permitted at all times, except between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m.

PROPANE GAS TANKS

Other than for BBOs – permit required

A tank must not exceed a capacity of 125 USWG (420 lb.). Other provisions apply to the installation of a propane gas tank in a residential area. Call the Citizen Service Centre 311 for information before installing a propane tank.

Before proceeding with the installation, call the Citizen Service Centre at 3 311.



FIRE HYDRANTS

The use of water mains, fire hydrants, valves or other components of the water supply system is prohibited without a permit issued by the city. Fees may apply.



NO NEED TO GO ANYWHERE!

Now you can apply for a permit online, 24/7, quickly and easily, and have it sent directly to your home. There's no need to go anywhere! The following types of permits can be issued online.

- Interior renovations
- ▶ Pool
- ▶ Exterior repairs

- ▶ Cutting dead, sick or dangerous trees

PETS

License mandatory, renewable every year

Inside a single dwelling unit or on a single property, you may keep up to five animals: a maximum of two dogs and no more than three cats. Dog or cat owners or sitters must purchase licenses for their pets. Animals are allowed in parks provided they are kept on a leash, with the exception of dog parks (see pages 27, 28 and 30).

You can purchase a license at one of our tax counters or online at emilinet.

Since August 2020, it is allowed to keep or own at most two pitbulls in a housing unit or on the same property if certain conditions are met.

FENCES

Permit not required except for residents of Vieux-Longueuil's heritage area

A fence is required in the following cases:

- when installing a pool;
- when storing equipment or materials outdoors:
- when a building or an excavation site poses a danger to public safety.

The design and finish of any fence must be compliant so as not to cause injury.



GARDEN SHEDS



Permit required

One garden shed per property is permitted. A garden shed is an ancillary building used to store garden and other equipment. The maximum surface area that a garden shed can occupy depends on the number of units and on the size of the yard.

ECOCENTRES

Before leaving home:

- Sort your materials by category and make sure their volume does not exceed 2.5 m³;
- Have proof of residency and your vehicle registration.

Where to go?

The drop-off site is determined based on the type of materials. Only the Payer ecocentre accepts commercial materials, for a fee.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Aerosol cans, car batteries, propane tanks, chlorine, glue, bleach, tar, oil, herbicides, insecticides, pesticides, liquid paint in original cans, household cleaning products, solvents, fluorescent tubes, compact fluorescent bulbs, etc.



COMPUTER AND COMMUNICATION DEVICES



TIRES

Without rims, less than 123 cm in diameter.



CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS

Lumber, asphalt shingles, drywall, etc.



METAL AND SCRAP METAL

Metal pieces and parts, microwave ovens, stoves, dishwashers, washers, dryers, etc.



GRANULAR MATERIALS

Rock, brick, concrete, asphalt, etc.



BRANCHES AND TREE TRUNKS Maximum 2.5 m in length.



UNCONTAMINATED SOIL



STRIPS OF SOD

RECYCLABLE MATERALS
Paper, cardboard, plastic,
glass, metal containers, etc.



BULKY ITEMS

Armchairs, sofas, mattresses, furniture, etc.



APPLIANCES CONTAINING HALOCARBONS

Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, etc.



GREEN WASTE

Weeds, dead leaves, plants, prunings, grass clippings, cedar hedge clippings, etc.



FREE SERVICE

For all Agglomération de Longueuil residents:

- 12 visits per year;
- Maximum vehicle length permitted is 7.5 m (including trailer).



Place at the edge of your property after 8 p.m. the day before the pick-up or no later than 7 a.m. on the day of the pick-up.





GARBAGE AND RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

The collection of recyclables alternates every two weeks, depending on your area. Recyclable materials are collected every two weeks, depending on your sector. Place your bin at the edge of the curb so as not to interfere with snow removal or street cleaning operations. Remember to put your bin away once its contents have been picked up.

BULKY ITEMS

- If you want to get rid of bulky items, such as old furniture or mattresses, these must be placed curbside on collection day every two weeks (the day varies according to the sector).
- Remove the doors from ovens, dishwashers, washers and dryers, and tie carpeting into rolls measuring at most 1 metre in length.
- Household appliances containing halocarbons (refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners) are not accepted.

GREEN WASTE, BRANCHES AND CHRISTMAS TREES

Green waste and branch pick-ups are scheduled throughout the year, from spring to fall, in addition to the Christmas tree pick-up.

- Green waste must ideally be placed in paper bags to optimize composting. Orange or clear plastic bags are tolerated. Black or green garbage bags will not be accepted.
- Tie branches less than 5 cm in diameter into bundles of no more than 30 cm in diameter and 1 m in length. Branches placed in bins, bags or boxes will not be accepted.
- In early January, Christmas trees are picked up for composting.
 Remove decorations and place the tree horizontally at the curb; do not wrap it or tie it up.

COLLECTION OF ORGANIC WASTE

Organic waste collection is available in all areas except for multi-unit dwellings of eight units or more. Voluntary drop-off sites are open to citizens. You can place your organic waste in paper bags or transfer the content of your containers into the brown bins.

PLASTIC BAGS

The city bans the distribution of certain types of shopping bags in retail stores in order to encourage people to change their habits when it comes to using these bags, thereby reducing their environmental impact.



LANDSCAPING

It is important to avoid extending your landscaping work too close to the curb to prevent it from being damaged during street cleaning or snow removal operations.

SNOW REMOVAL

The city begins by plowing the snow that has accumulated on boulevards and streets. If necessary, the plowed snow is then blown onto lots or into trucks.

Snow blowing operations may be triggered by the accumulation of 10 cm or more of snow in the following order of priority: main arteries, schools, public transit lines, collector lanes and local streets with at least one sidewalk.

Moreover, it is prohibited to dispose of snow from a private property in ditches, sewers, streets, lanes, sidewalks, public areas, or on any other property. All property owners must ensure that the person who carries out snow removal operations on their property has a permit to do so.

WINTER STREET PARKING

From December 1 to April 1, overnight parking is prohibited on all of Longueuil's streets when snow removal operations (spreading, plowing, blowing) have been announced.

Any vehicle parked on the street, between midnight and 6 a.m., during a snow removal operation, is in violation of bylaw CO 2014 859. Fines will be issued and offenders' vehicles may be towed at the owners' expense.

When temporary or removable signage has been installed to prohibit street parking during snow removal operations, it is prohibited to park vehicles on the street. Citizens are responsible for consulting snow removal notices, which are issued by 5 p.m. daily, when applicable.

VEHICLE TOWING

Seized or abandoned vehicles whose owners cannot be found are stored at the impound yard.

During snow removal operations, illegally parked cars will be towed to nearby streets so as not to impede the work. Towing fees may be added to a parking ticket and collected by the municipal court.

To recover your vehicle, dial @ 911 to contact the Agglomération de Longueuil police department to find out its location.



NOISE

At all times, it is prohibited to make excessive noise that might disturb the neighbours. It is also prohibited to make noise in public places in order to attract attention or solicit the public for commercial purposes.

CONSTRUCTION OF A PARKING AREA



Permit required

All parking areas must be covered with interlocking paving stones, asphalt or concrete. As stipulated in the effective by-law, work related to paying, borders, drainage, marking and signage in a parking area must comply with construction deadlines.

VEHICLE STORAGE

Parking or storing certain types of vehicles is prohibited on residential properties. Call the Citizen service centre (2) 311 for more information.

VEHICLES FOR SALE

In order not to interfere with visibility, the Highway Safety Code prohibits operating a vehicle whose windows are obstructed by any object, including "For sale" signs. A municipal by-law also prohibits parking a for-sale vehicle in the street. Only the vehicle owner's private driveway may be used for this purpose.

UNAUTHORIZED VEHICLES

Recreational vehicles are prohibited on public or private property. Recreational vehicles include motocross bikes, snowmobiles, ATVs, and motorcycles.

CAR WASHING

Car washing is permitted with a hose fitted with a spray nozzle or an automatic shutoff valve.









TREES



Permit required to fell a tree

Trees are a crucial element of our landscape—they beautify our environment, reduce heat islands and purify the air we breathe.

Trees in urban areas create shade, helping to alleviate the stresses of climate change on communities.

Each property must feature at least one large tree (deciduous or coniferous) per 125 m², and large trees must be planted at least every 8 linear metres along streets and parks, and around large parking lots.

EMERALD ASH BORER

The emerald ash borer is an insect that attacks all types of ash trees. If you have ash trees on your property, call an expert to have them inspected as soon as possible. The expert will determine if your trees can be treated or if they need to be felled. The ash tree treatment period spans from June 15 to August 31. If you need to prune or fell your ash trees, the authorized period runs from October 1 to March 15. Make sure to adequately dispose of ash tree trimmings during the special pick-ups organized by the city, or bring them to the Marie-Victorin or Payer ecocentres.

DOOR-TO-DOOR SALES

Permit required

In Longueuil, door-to-door salespeople must first obtain a permit. Permit holders must comply with certain requirements that prohibit them from soliciting on legal holidays and on Sundays, as well as in public areas.



GARAGE SALES

Four garage sales are generally* allowed every year, on a fixed date, per unit.

Two blocks of two consecutive weekends have been scheduled for garage sales:

- Spring: the last full weekend of May and the following weekend:
- Fall: the last full weekend of September and the following weekend.

Garage sales are permitted only on the designated weekends. No permit is required.

POOLS AND SPAS



Permit required

Before determining the location of your pool or spa, check with the public utilities (Bell Canada, Énergir, Hydro-Québec, Vidéotron, etc.) to find out if there are underground ducts or cables on your property.

FILLING SWIMMING POOLS

Filling swimming pools is prohibited between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. It is also prohibited to fill a swimming pool with a hose measuring more than 2 cm in diameter.

For pools with a volume of more than 9,000 L, citizens may use a hose with a diameter larger than 2 cm, but a permit is required. It costs \$20, is valid for four days, and is non-renewable. A maximum of two permits may be issued during the same year for the same building. You can obtain your permit at City Hall at 4250 chemin de la Savane.

POOL FILTERS, WATER HEATERS AND HEAT PUMPS



Permit required

A heat pump, water heater or pool filter, air conditioning unit or other similar equipment must be located at least 1 m from the property line (2 m if you live in the Le Moyne sector). In all cases, equipment installed on the ground that can be seen from a public street must be hidden from view by vegetation. The noise level at the property line must not exceed 53 dB(A). It is strictly prohibited to connect a heat pump, water heater, pool or spa filter, cooling system or other similar equipment to the municipal aqueduct network. Other provisions may apply. Call the Citizen Service Centre ② 311 for more information.

CHIMNEY SWEEPING

You may clean your chimney yourself or hire a chimney sweep. You can sweep your chimney yourself or entrust this work to a chimney sweep. The fire safety service of the agglomeration of Longueuil neither recommends nor accredits no chimney sweeping company. However, he wishes to put warns citizens who are solicited by certain entrepreneurs not having the necessary qualifications. To ensure your safety, choose a qualified contractor who is a member of the Association of Heating Professionals (APC) at poelesfoyers.ca.



OUTDOOR FIRES

In urban areas, outdoor fires constitute a fire hazard and may cause annoyance to your neighbours. No outdoor fire may be lit without prior permission from the Agglomération de Longueuil fire department. The burning of garbage or construction material is strictly prohibited.

Outdoor wood-burning fireplaces are prohibited everywhere on the territory of Longueuil. However, gas-burning stoves are authorized in all boroughs.

LONGUEUIL STANDS FOR RECREATION AND MUTUAL AID

Longueuil works with close to 500 non-profit organizations to make our city a great place in which to live. Whether for leisure and recreation, cultural activities, amateur sports, education and training, community development or personal assistance, the regular activities and services offered by these organizations, which are fully recognized by the city, contribute to the city's vitality and to the enrichment of its social and community life.

These organizations are involved in organizing annual events, such as **Seniors' week**, as well as planning a host of youth events and volunteer recognition activities. In partnership with the city, they also run some thirty day camps in all the neighbourhoods, as well as the Salon des camps de jour in the spring.

The youth centres and the municipal recreational program Cité Ados centres, are meeting* places where preteens and teens aged 9-11 and 12-17 can have fun and participate in activities such as pool, table tennis and foosball, video games and board games, supervised by enthusiastic, friendly and sympathetic monitors. Special activities such as tournaments, outings and theme nights are organized on a regular basis.

Longueuil has been a member of Senior Friendly Cities since 2013, and of Child Friendly Cities since 2018. To make sure to include all its citizens, the city establishes an annual action plan to ensure universal accessibility for people with disabilities. The city also has an action plan regarding racism and discrimination, as well as a family policy. LIVING, ACCESSIBLE LIBRARIES

Registration for the library is free and gives residents access to a vast and varied collection of documents. Simply go to any one of our municipal libraries and show proof of identification and address to get your Accès Longueuil card. The libraries offer hundreds of activities all year long for people of all ages: story time, kids' activities, workshops, training sessions, and lectures!

YOUR PLACE OR MINE?

From any one of the city's libraries or from home, residents can consult the Léonard online catalogue to search for documents or check their availability. Subscribers can also request a personal identification number (PIN) at any one of the Ville de Longueuil's libraries. This PIN allows users to:

- consul their file online:
- reserve books or renew loans remotely;
- have documents from elsewhere in the network delivered to the library of their choice;
- access the numerous online resources available (newspapers, music, training courses, etc.).

AN IMPRESSIVE DIGITAL COLLECTION

With more than 20,000 ebooks, the digital collection also allows access to more than 4,000 daily newspapers from around the world in over 60 languages. Members can also access online training sessions, genealogy resources, music and more.

LONGUEUIL: A READING CITY

In 2005, Ville de Longueuil became the first city in Québec to adopt a Reading city charter. In this charter, the city recognizes that reading and literacy are essential to personal, family and community development. In 2016, an action plan developed in partnership with local organizations was unveiled to the public and has already led to several concrete measures.

LONGUEUIL STAND FOR CULTURE AND ENTERTAINMENT

Longueuil and its partners offer a host of activities, celebrations and events that make the city a vibrant and welcoming place. For example the Marché de Noël et des traditions de Longueuil, the festivities surrounding the fête nationale du Québec and Canada Day, as well as Lumifest are just a few of the events that are attended annually by thousands of festival-goers.

Exhibits are also shown in Longueuil's public libraries, as well as at the Centre d'exposition et d'animation en art actuel Plein sud, the Théâtre de la Ville, the cultural centres, and the édifice Marcel-Robidas.


Thanks to its numerous cultural partners on its territory, Longueuil also stages performing arts workshops, professional shows and popular cultural events, such as the Festival Petits bonheurs, and the Journées de la culture.

Longueuil operates a Bureau de la culture et des bibliothèques, which is mandated, among other things, to develop culture and promote major cultural projects in Longueuil. As for the Conseil des arts de Longueuil, its mission is to support the creation, production and dissemination of professional-quality art throughout the territory.

The City has also published a Policy in urban art, the main objectives of which are to publicize works of urban art and their creators, to supervise the phenomenon unwanted graffiti and render accessible options allowed for this type of artistic practice.

The City has also set up a Framework integration of art into buildings and public places in order to highlight and develop the collection public works of art.


Longueuil's built heritage is a testimony to close to 360 years of history that began with the seigneurie of Longueuil. The current city covers a vast territory replete with buildings that bear the traces of the many different eras that have marked its evolution—many of which date back to the French Regime.

A testament to its rich history, Longueuil's built heritage resonates with the echoes of its faraway roots, the settlement of its villages and the tribulations of its founders, the bustle of its economy built on transportation and industry, and the memories of its history as a resort destination.

When we pay attention to our surroundings, the still-visible traces of our history leap out at us. A very good example of this is the Parc archéologique de la Baronnie, located in Vieux-Longueuil, where Charles Le Moyne Sr., Longueuil's first seigneur, ordered the construction of what are now some of the oldest buildings on Montréal's South Shore.
